## WEEEKLY HOLDS UPDATE

## Week 11-18 January 2002

## **HIGHLIGHTS:**

- The level of holds exceeds \$5.0 billion
- Releases from hold, especially based on additional information provided, practically at zero level
- Electricity sector application worth over US\$20.0M placed on hold
- More applications placed on hold for end-use/user information
- 1. The holds stand at **US\$5,038.0 million** this week, to include US\$345.5M in "inactive hold" category. The grand total has increased by some US\$87.0 million in comparison to the previous week's total of US\$4,951.0M.
- 2. As of last week, there were 222 applications worth some US\$371.0 million in the category of inactive holds. This week the value and the number of applications in this category are lower and stand at **219 applications worth US\$345.5 million.** At the same time, the number of applications for which a feedback from the holding mission is due in excess of 60 days has rose again and now stands at **474 applications worth US\$1,574.0M** (440 worth US\$1,306.0M previous week).
- 3. The total number of applications on hold ("active") is **1,714** (to include **1,179** humanitarian and **535** oil spare parts applications) or 50 more than 1,664 last week. The relative value of holds has remained similar as last week with 18.5 percent of the total value circulated to the Committee or **14.4** per cent of the value circulated to the Committee AND approved by OIP based on pre-approved lists (18.3 and 14.3 respectively during the previous week).
- 4. GENERAL TRENDS: As expected, holds have exceeded the %5.0 billion benchmark over the last week. Apart from new holds, this situation is compounded by practically no releases on the basis if additional information submitted or any feedback whatsoever long time after the information had been provided. The number of applications with no feedback in excess of 60 days is approaching 5000 and the total value if \$1,574 million or almost one third of the total value on hold. The situation is further aggravated with numerous applications being placed on hold for end-use/user information only even in cases where there were no technical or "dual use" objections. The hardest hit sectors are "Special Allocation" (75%), Water-sanitation (34.8%), Education (29%), Electricity (27%) and Transport and Telecommunications (25.5%).
- 5. **HIGH-VALUE APPLICATION PLACED ON HOLD IN ELECTRICITY SECTOR:** A US\$20.14 million application in electricity sector (**Comm.1001297**, substation equipment) was placed on hold last week for specifications on pumps, valves, cabling, tool kits, etc.

**6.** A NUMBER OF APPLICATIONS AGAIN PLACED ON HOLD FOR END-USE/USER INFORMATION: The observed trend of holds for end-use /user information has continued with 20 of 47 applications placed on hold containing end-use/user information as, at least, a part of the reason for hold. In 10 of 20 cases, to include some of the largest comms, end-use/user information was the only reason for hold. The goods in this category this week included the following comms:

- 7. Only **4 applications worth US\$2.66M** were released last week. All 4 of the releases were merely several-day holds placed for "pending further evaluation".
- 8. Total of **47 applications worth US\$90.3M** was placed on hold during the last week. Most of the relevant comms have been placed on hold for end-use/user info exclusively or for other reasons as well, and are consequently listed in para 6 above. Other holds included:
