# TWO HUNDRED AND SIXTY THIRD REPORT OF THE OVERSEERS TO THE SECURITY COUNCIL COMMITTEE ESTABLISHED BY RESOLUTION 661 (1990) CONCERNING THE SITUATION BETWEEN IRAQ AND KUWAIT

The following report is submitted to the Security Council Committee established by resolution 661 (1990) concerning the situation between Iraq and Kuwait pursuant to paragraph 14 of the Committee Procedures, by which the Overseers were required to submit a weekly report to the Committee on the contracts considered by them with regard to sale of petroleum and petroleum products originating in Iraq, including the cumulative quantity and approximate value of petroleum authorized for export.

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1. During the reporting period, 15 December to 22 December 2001, 10 new contracts were approved. (For details see, table 1)

2. In accordance with paragraphs 12 and 13 of the Procedures, 14 letters of credit and amendments for 10 liftings were confirmed by the Overseers.

3. Eight loadings, (3 from Mina-al-Bakr, 5 from Ceyhan), comprising 9.7 million barrels, (4.9 from Mina-al-Bakr, 4.8 from Ceyhan) with an estimated value of Euro 176 million were completed (\$158 million at current rate of exchange).

4. The revenue generated from the beginning of Phase XI at current prices is estimated at about Euro 360 million (\$ 324 million at current rate of exchange).

5. The average price for Iraqi crude during the reporting period was approximately \$16.3/bbl or Euro 18.1/bbl.

6. The trading window for the Far East is now for loadings during February 2002. Contract holders are not offering the oil for premia of less than \$0.40/barrel over the OSP. As far as the US/West is concerned a sizable volume was sold for between \$0.40 and \$0.50 barrel over the OSP for January loading. No deals were reported for Europe.

#### **OBSERVATIONS**

#### 3.1 MINA AL-BAKR

*Terminal Manning*; Terminal fully manned (ca. 80 people)

Mooring Boats/Tugs; No mooring boats on station at the terminal.

Tugs "TAJ AL MARAK", "ALTAHADY", "FATTEH AL MOBEEN" and "AL RAYIAH" on stand-by.

*Power*; Several power cuts daily this week; generators are working on alternating basis.

Transport to / from terminal; The tender No. 366 is out of service.

*Services*; The new R/O is in function ok. Water is rather discoloured (brownish). Only cold water is supplied. Bottled water is potable and still in supply.

*Food*; Terminal food continues to be of extremely poor quality. Meals served are bad, however, some improvement has been observed. Fruit and vegetables were fresh. All UN staff meals self-catering or on board vessels.

Housekeeping; Standard of cleanliness remains moderate to poor.

*Infestation*; No de-infestation carried out this week. In spite of Saybolt staff carrying out regular de-infestation in both living and sleeping accommodation areas, cockroaches are ever present; Presence even in the beds.

*Safety*; No accidents. No fire drill or safety exercises observed this week. No local contingency plan for emergencies such as outbreak of fire, serious illness or accidents to staff.

The supplied Life Boats remain stored on Platform B. The construction of the launch davits necessary for the Life Boats are still not completed, and has been suspended from December 2000. *Environmental conditions*; Terminal garbage, waste and used lubricating oil continues to be disposed of directly into the sea. Gangways and pumps are leaking excessive quantities of hydraulic oil resulting in very slippery conditions at the platforms. Sand or sawdust to clean up the oil is to be received from the vessels: no stock on the island.

*Other remarks*; The relationship between Saybolt/UN staff and local terminal personnel is good. Gangway at berth 3 has broken down and replaced by an incorrect one. Repair of the original takes some time as it is an aluminium construction. There are also some hydraulic problems at the loading-arm at berth 3.

Pumping rate: Average pumping rate during this week was: 30,000 barrels/hr
